News from the Parish Council

The main item on the agenda in November was setting the Budget and Precept for 2024-25. The Precept is the part of the council tax which is collected by the District Council on behalf of the Parish Council. The figures for a draft Budget were reviewed and it was agreed to increase the Precept by £500 to £13,500 (an increase of 4%).

The problems with the blocked sewage pipes and flooding in the village were reported to Anglian Water and Highways respectively. The District Councillor, Mike Hankins is going to follow-up the problem with the sewers to ensure that the matter has been dealt with properly. Highways have programmed works to clear out the drains and ditches properly. If you notice any problems on the roads or public right of ways including flooding, blocked drains and potholes, please do notify the County Council using the highways defect reporting app: https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/roads/report-a-problem.

If you notice a problem with a street light do contact the Clerk (details above).

The nature reserve at the bottom of the Rec is open for quiet walks. Please note that the main purpose is a have an area set aside for wildlife so it is a dog-free area. Please make sure that dogs do not enter the site.

The Parish Council is approaching the War Memorial Trust to enquire about a grant to add three new names to the Memorial: one from the First World War (Fredrick John Thorpe) and two from the Second (Fredrick Stephen Girling and (Elijah) Reginald Margetson. It is hoped that a grant would cover 50% of the cost cleaning the memorial, adding the names and repainting the all the names.

The Parish Council has some money available from the hardship grant which was awarded to the Parish Council in 2020 for distribution to those in need. If you are finding it difficult to pay bills, do please contact the Clerk for an application form.
